Revolutionary Stage	Examples During the _____ Revolution
1. Impossible demands made of government which, if granted, would mean its end.	
2. Unsuccessful government attempts to suppress revolutionaries.	
3. Revolutionaries gain power and seem united.	
4. Once in power, revolutionaries begin to quarrel among themselves, and unity begins to dissolve.	
5. The moderates gain the leadership but fail to satisfy those who insist on further changes.	

<p>6. Power is gained by progressively more radical groups until finally a lunatic fringe gains almost complete control.</p>	
<p>7. A strong man emerges and assumes great power.</p>	
<p>8. The extremists try to create a "heaven on earth" by introducing their whole program and by punishing all their opponents.</p>	
<p>9. A period of terror occurs.</p>	
<p>10. Moderate groups regain power. The revolution is over.</p>
